The Institute will be using her new CORE Curriculum, 911 Zone Training & Skills Assessment and StarZ II Call Receiving and Radio Dispatch Simulators in order to create a realistic environment to train citizens for careers in Public Safety. Response to the program has been exceptional and the Institute plans to add to their current purchases in order to bring the total number of StarZ units to ten by the end of the year. The program will involve both lab and classroom training.

According to Mr. Einsig, he was 'overwhelmed' when all the products began arriving; but with the purchase of the Professional Pride Running Start Program 'he has more help than he ever imagined'. During Sue's one-day on-site consultation and training with Brian, 'we had a lot of fun playing with StarZ' as well as reviewing and learning how to use the PowerPoint's and other training aids supplied by Professional Pride. The college tech was there ready to learn how to put together the complicated simulator - only to find out he wasn't needed.

"Bryan was really impressed with the taped calls on CD, the screaming domestic, the sound effects. He loved it that the students could practice and hand in tapes. He worked in EZ CAD and it was such a relief to him not to have to purchase a CAD system or do without. We copied both EZ CAD and instructions onto every computer in the lab. I made up some scenarios to start EZ CAD their first day.

Not only does he have enough to begin training his college students, with Target (that he also purchased) he is hoping to reach out to the local agencies to put on classes for experienced people because there isn't much out there for them.

I was shown around the college - even saw the new Harley Davidson classroom. Now, with a 911 Lab York has a lot to be proud of. True leadership in PA." said Ms Pivetta.
