Each call has AGE/SEX/CONDITION/HISTORY

EMERGENCY MEDICAL DESCRIPTIONS

Scoring: 20 Shorts X 5 Points = 100 Points

1. 13 YOF exp severe abdominal pain, feeling dizzy, no HX of illness or pregnancy.
2. 64 YOM, cons, SOB, unable to speak in full sentences. Sudden onset of chest pain, diaph, naus, on meds for high blood pressure.
3. 3 YOM, cons, BN, crushing injuries to the hand, caught his hand in machinery, the hand is out.
4. 14 YOM, uncons, BN, consumed large quantity of whiskey in the last four hours, unable to arouse him.
5. 45 YOF cons, SOB, asthma condition, unable to alleviate with asthma medication.
6. 69 YOF, semi cons, SOB was found in her bed by a friend in this state. She is an insulin dependent diabetic.
7. 38 YOF, psyc patient, attempt suicide/slashing wrists. Cons, BN, restrained by nursing staff,
8. 20 YOF, imminent birth. Pains 5 minutes apart, water has not broken, first birth, full term, has a history of toxemia
9. 2 YOM, cons breathing normally, scald burns to the face and chest from a coffee pot pulled over.
10. 10 YOF with possible leg FX from car/bicycle accident. The bike ran into a parked vehicle
11. Fall injury construction site, male Pt fell from scaffolding onto metal rebar, penetration to leg. No further on condition.
12. 18 YOF severe abd pain, bleeding very heavy and feeling too dizzy to sit upright. Pt had an abortion, 3 days ago.
13. 38 YOM, stab wound back shldr. Pt AOB states his wife assaulted him with a knife. Wife has left the scene, PD enroute.
14. 22 YOM, cons now but was uncons briefly, BN, electrical burns to both arms. Pt working in a ditch

15. 5 YOF seizure. Third seizure today. Mother states new med for the seizure. Numerous other med and severe retardation.
16. 20 YOM, GSW to the head, uncons, raspy breathing. The caller is a 15 YOM states he accidentally shot his brother PD enroute CPR refused.
17. 65 YOF, semi cons, BN, apparent paralysis to the rt side. HX prior strokes/found in this condition by a visiting nurse.
18. 39 YOM unable to stop vomiting. Pt alcoholic states he recently had a head inj, within last 24 hours. Meet PD with 'Rv'cv"vj k'iqecv'qp0
19. 3 YOM, uncons, not breathing, found by a babysitter after a nap, CPR in progress by phone. No HX of illness or injury.
20. 57 YOM, cons, difficulty breathing, chest pain for two hours, angina history, nitro times two with no relief.

Abbreviation Guide:

YOF=Year old female; YOM=Year old male; BN=Breathing normally; Pt=Patient; HX=History; SOB=Short of breath; Cons=Conscious; FX=Fracture; AOB=Alcohol on breath.
